Grocery help: Do you know someone who will be struggling to get groceries into their home this winter? Store To Door is a nonprofit dedicated to helping seniors remain living independently in their homes. Grocery shopping and delivery services are offered to seniors and people with disabilities throughout the Twin Cities. Store To Door clients work with a friendly volunteer order taker who regularly calls to take their grocery order over the phone. Volunteer shoppers fill the order at a designated grocery store, and a consistent Store To Door staff person delivers the groceries into the client's kitchen. Clients pay for the groceries, along with a service fee, when they receive the groceries. The service fee is on a sliding scale, based on the client's income level. King Field Empty Bowls: This year's "Empty Bowls" event will be held on Feb. 9 from 4-8 p.m. at King Park. The event that brings the community together to share a meal of soup and bread donated by local restaurants out of handmade bowls donated by local artists. All profits are given to Nicollet Square. For a suggested donation of \$20, community members eat dinner and take the bowl home as a reminder of our many neighbors who are in need of food and shelter. This event drew over 850 people last year, and raised almost \$10,000 for Nicollet Square. The facility at 3700 Nicollet Av. S. is home to 42 formerly homeless youth. 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Reflection by Fr. Leo

Jesus tells his disciples in Matthew's gospel this morning, that they are salt of the earth and light of the world. This is Christ's message to us, who choose to be his disciples. I think the hardest part of Jesus' message for all of us is to accept that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

For many of us, the spiritual life is an absorption in our weakness and failures. This leads us to be self-absorbed and distant from God. Knowing God's love for us and his ability to transform us into his light, escapes us if we focus on our faults. Not that we don't have them. We need to believe in God's love and forgiveness.

The Lord, like any parent, wants us to focus on our chosen-ness, God desires that we accept his love and let his Spirit transform us into effective disciples. When we accept God's mercy, we can be merciful. When we accept God's unconditional love, we can love unconditionally.

This last week the gospel for Monday was about Jesus incredible freeing of the possessed man and the swine running into the sea. The people were so astonished that they asked Jesus to leave that area. I think we too, fear God and don't trust that he wants to make us whole like the possessed man, who becomes an apostle to his family when they find him in his "right" mind when he returns home.

Let us ask the Lord this week to help us accept his call and his gifts of the Spirit, that we may become the salt of the earth and the light of the world.
